

How to request the HOSPICE accompani- ment service?

Contact us by phone, email, or via our website. This can be done by the person themselves, their family, someone close to them, or through a referral from a member of their social or healthcare team.

Is there a cost?

Thanks to the funds raised by the IFCC Association, the HOSPICE accompaniment service is offered free of charge to anyone who needs it, for as long as they need it. There may be a contribution/cost for the home care service, depending on a prior assessment of the applicant's financial situation.
